4. Ordinary Business

4.1 Board President's Report

Despite the effect of the Covid19 pandemic 2021 has been a very busy year for the RACI.

On the international scene, we have been involved with Pacifichem particularly around the unhappiness of members with the poor value for money of the virtual pricing of a hybrid conference. The Conference has since moved to a fully virtual event mitigating these concerns.

We have also been involved in the creation and launch of the Federation of Commonwealth Chemical Societies [ComChem] through V. Gardiner and R Stapleford, the past president and CEO of the RACI.

From a national perspective Covid19 prevented the majority of physical events from occurring however, utilising the virtual space, the same number of events had still been presented although with fewer participants and a much lower income. QLD was fortunate enough to run two well attended physical student events one in Townsville and a recent one in the Gold Coast.

It is important that we begin to run physical events as soon as we are able as we need their revenuegenerating ability.

On the membership side, we are the largest and oldest scientific professional society but our numbers are still slowly dwindling and we need to turn this around. 50% plus of our members have been with us for 20+ years however, although we are attracting many young members, we are failing to keep many of them. 28% of our members are female and we need to increase this.

As a professional membership organisation, the RACI had to be seen to uphold our professional standards and, to assist members with this, the Code of Conduct had been modernised and all members were advised to avail themselves of the new document on the website.

The President proposed a motion to thank the outgoing Board members, Maree Stuart, Greg Ewing, Renate Griffith, Dave Springer and Cynthia Cliff for their great contribution over the years. This was seconded by P. Thordarson.

The president also proposed a vote of thanks to the RACI staff whose hard work in very trying lock-down conditions helped keep the RACI going and the Branches and Divisions to run events and provide benefits to members.

In closing the President stated that he hoped and believed 2022 would be a better year for the organisation.

The president again thanked the outgoing members for their contributions over the years.

4.3 Financial Report

A comparison of the income and expenditure figures was shared by the Treasurer to illustrate the effect the Covid epidemic had on the finances over the past 2 years. Income dropped \$470K over the 2 years while expenditure dropped by \$530K. A surplus of \$71K was still achieved in 2021 but this was purely because of government support through the Job Keeper program that contributed \$320K. Without this support, the RACI would have run at a deficit of \$250K.

Membership income and employment expenses were similar over the 2 years however due to the lower-income and expenditure figures in 2021 the pie graphs showed a very large increase in the % of the total income and expenditure. The graphs also showed how the lack of activity in the events and schools outreach sectors had decreased their % contributions to the totals in 2021.

A graphical overview of the operating income performance of the RACI over the last 11 years was presented. The first 5 years had been very poor, but in the last 6 years, the organisation had performed much better with a minor deficit in 1 of the years and a surplus in the other 5.

A similar graphical overview was given for the cost to the RACI of the Chemistry in Australia magazine to illustrate one of the steps taken to improve the overall operational finances. Over this period the cost of the magazine to the RACI dropped from \$160K to 18K. Actions taken such as the reduction in the number of editions and charging for delivery contributed to this movement.

The final information shared was an overview of the membership numbers over the past 11 years. These had fallen dramatically in the first 6 years of this period but had stabilised at around 4100 over the next 5 years but fallen by 200 in 2021 – possibly Covid related.

The treasurer highlighted the main challenges and opportunities facing the RACI in 2022:

- Covid-19 risks
- Member attraction and retention
- Event Income
- Maintaining performance to budget.

Registrations

136 registrations (83 members, 49 student members, and 4 non-members), which is great! 72 dinner tickets purchased

Invitations

65 Keynote/Invited invitations sent with 75% accepted, 3% declined and some others are yet to reply and we are chasing them up. Very pleased with the response. Most – not all – invitations have gone to Australians. However, a number of international invitations have been accepted as well. Very pleased with the acceptance rate.

Some more names were received in the last 2 days and invitations are being sent out.

Program

A skeleton program is available on the web, and the webpage is continually being updated. There are also likely to be some additional social events and industry presentations on non-research matters in the exhibition hall.

Finances

Financially we have significant expenses in December however our budget is in a good place and we will be able to cover these.

Sponsorship/Exhibition

Sponsorship is heading in the right direction (\$85,000), with several organisations expecting to make commitments in early 2022.

Contingency for COVID

If the Congress cannot run in July this will be problematic. We would need to postpone as we would be unable to recover costs incurred so far through an online-only conference and in addition the high registration costs could not be be justified. A hybrid option has been ruled out as it is too expensive due to excessive AV costs resulting from multiple streams. There will be an option for international keynote speakers to present online if necessary.
