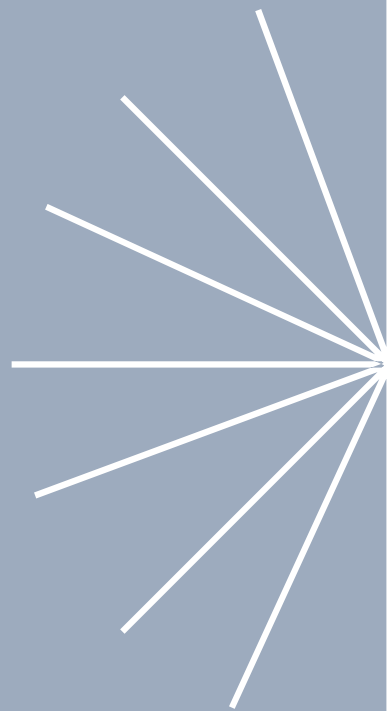
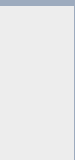


NATIONAL AWARDS 2022
